Does the IC agreement increase Anaconda-Deer Lodge County’s (ADLC) financial liability?

The IC agreement reduces the County’s financial liability. It replaces the “1994 Conveyance Agreement” with Atlantic Richfield (AR). In the old (1994) agreement, the County agreed to pay for maintaining the remedy on all properties given to the County by AR. **In the IC agreement, ADLC is PAID** to do this work by Atlantic Richfield. For instance, if the Old Works Golf Course were to close, **under our current (1994) agreement**, the County would have to pay to convert the golf course to another use. **Under the IC agreement**, the property goes back to AR **at no cost to the County**. It is then Atlantic Richfield’s responsibility to keep the remedy in place and make sure the property is used appropriately.
